At this time of term, with assessments out of the way, there is a tendency to take short cuts.



I write this week to give guidance on how it may be possible to use (some) holiday time in a productive manner when April finally arrives. This first term, at twelve weeks, is the longest I can remember. The temptation therefore is to switch off completely from school when the term ends next Friday. A long term means a well-deserved holiday. The reality however is that the time available for academics in term two is shorter than is ideal – mainly due to Easter being late and the five-day weekend of 27 April-1 May. This means that from 2 May there will be less than three full timetable cycles until the mid-year exams begin. That seems awfully close when you look at it from that perspective.

I'm going to suggest that one, or perhaps even two days, somewhere early in the holidays, be used for term 2 preparation, with the following objectives in mind:

- Declutter: Your desk, your room, your clothes, your inbox, your social media feeds. Clarity = better use of time.
- Plan: Plan what a work week in term 2 will look like. You know what your extramural commitments will be. You know when parents evenings are, or when you will travel to Jeppe or Pretoria, or wherever else. Make it work!
- Prioritise: Rank your tasks (at home and at school) in terms of priority and align them with the pressures you face from parents, friends and peers, and the pressures you put on yourself.

- Be effective: It's not a race. Don't try to be the most efficient, try to be the most effective. Perfectionism can be the enemy.
- Focus: It is really important to focus on the "vital few" rather than the "vital many".
- Finish the job: This is one the youth of today never mind increasingly distracted adults find particularly challenging. Develop your "finishing instinct" when you get to a task...complete it no matter what.Stop procrastinating: People tell me I procrastinate...and I've thought about it. But enough of that. Most people tend to tackle easy tasks first and push out the difficult ones don't fall into this trap, irrespective of the subject or the section!
- Stay organised: This is really what it is all about. Many people do not know what it means to be organised, or how to do it properly. There are different ways for different people to do that, but once you get organised, stay organised! The amount of time you will save during the course of term 2 if you have already set the framework for exam preparation is of huge value.

It an absolute pleasure to be at school last Saturday. Wherever you looked there was competitive sport, well-mannered and proud boys, supportive parents, and an excellent day was had by all. Many thanks to all who assisted on the day, including the large number of parent volunteers who helped out – you made a difference!

Our next full compulsory will be held on Saturday 20 May, when we host Parktown Boys from Johannesburg, and thereafter the highlight of our season on 3 June when Michaelhouse arrive for Old Boys Day.

The second term kicks off very quickly with a series of Parents' Evenings – see the dates elsewhere in this edition. These are the perfect opportunity to interact with staff and Grade Heads, and I encourage you to attend if you have any issues to discuss – we welcome the interaction. Also be aware that the annual trip to Johannesburg – Jeppe Boys this year – takes place on the first weekend back (21 & 22 April), and that all teams will be travelling.

Please be aware that school will close for the end of term at 10:30 on Friday 31 March. Reports for all grades will be handed out at that time.

What is Earth Hour?

Earth Hour is a global call for the protection of the planet and for people to take a stand against climate change.

What began as a local event in Sydney, Australia, in 2007, has exploded into a worldwide symbolic event focused on switching off the lights for one hour and to take climate action.

2016 saw an unprecedented 178 countries and territories participating and over 400 landmarks being switched off.

Each year on the last Saturday in March, hundreds of thousands use their collective voice to inspire, motivate and lead the charge on their hopes, dreams and concerns about the planet.

On home soil, South Africans got switched on to the power of Earth Hour in 2009 ahead of climate change talks in Copenhagen, Denmark. This momentum led WWF South Africa to inspire many more South Africans to sign up and switch off.

Every year Earth Hour mobilises more support for the planet, exceeding expectations and inspiring change on various environmental concerns:

- Fighting deforestation in Uganda
- A 10-year freeze on a new oil project in the Arctic
- The creation of a national park in Malaysia
- A reduction in energy usage in Brunei Darussalam and stronger climate change laws in Scotland and Switzerland
- In South Africa, inspiring people and organisations to use their power and say yes to renewable energy.
