Our sincere and grateful thanks go to all who were involved with another proud community event.

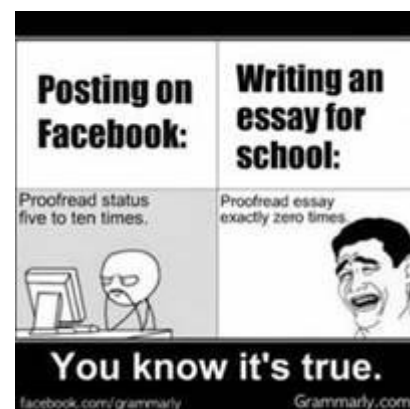
Exam are upon us, and for our Grade 8 group, this is their first major exam session with us. What follows is a brief summary of key regulations and guidelines for the next three weeks. For more detailed information, please see the "Academic Dishonesty" and "Exam Guidelines for Learners" documents which appear on the D6 Communicator.

For Grade 8 & 9 boys specifically:

- ✓ Arrive at school as usual, by 07h30. Report to your exam venue, which will remain the same throughout the exam block. Note that brief assemblies will be held on Monday and Friday mornings as usual.
- ✓ A study session takes place from 08h00-09h00 each exam day, followed by a break of 30 minutes.
- ✓ Boys who use e-books on their tablet computers will be permitted to use these devices during the study sessions, however no other devices are allowed.
- ✓ Boys are to report to the Lower Campus field for break. Tuckshop and toilet facilities are available on Lower Campus.
- ✓ At 09h30, a bell will ring and boys are to return to class, to begin writing at 09h45.
- ✓ Boys may be collected from school directly after the exam session.
- ✓ On days where no exam is written, study venues will be provided for boys who choose not to study at home.

For Grade 10-12 boys:

- ✓ You are only required to attend school for the sessions in which you write an exam.
- ✓ Please report to your exam venue (note that this may not always be the same venue each day) at least 30 minutes before the scheduled start time.



From the Headmaster Continued...

General information for all grades:

- ✓ Hair and uniform regulations remain in place throughout that exam block. To avoid sanction, ensure that you maintain the highest possible standards in terms of uniform, hair and shaving as necessary.
- ✓ Inappropriate school bags will not be tolerated. Drawstring and similar bags may not be worn on your back – this is disrespectful to the uniform and creates a poor impression in the community.
- ✓ If a boy is ill and unable to write an exam, please contact the school on the day of the examination. A Medical Certificate is required to validate any absence. This must be submitted on the day of return.
- ✓ The Homework Centre will continue to operate during the exam block.
- ✓ When carrying stationery into an exam venue, only transparent pencil cases or plastic sleeves will be allowed. Calculator covers are also not permitted.

These exams should be seen as an opportunity, not a burden. I strongly encourage parents to prioritise their children's needs over their own at this time. Stay close to your boys – to help and guide them through the natural pressures that they will experience between now and 30 June. The boys are stronger than they themselves believe, and it is up to us to unlock this resilience.

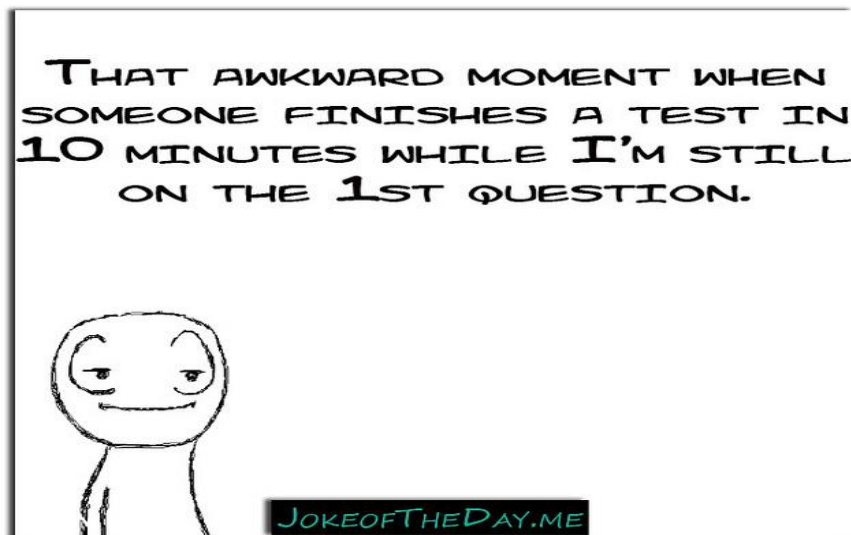

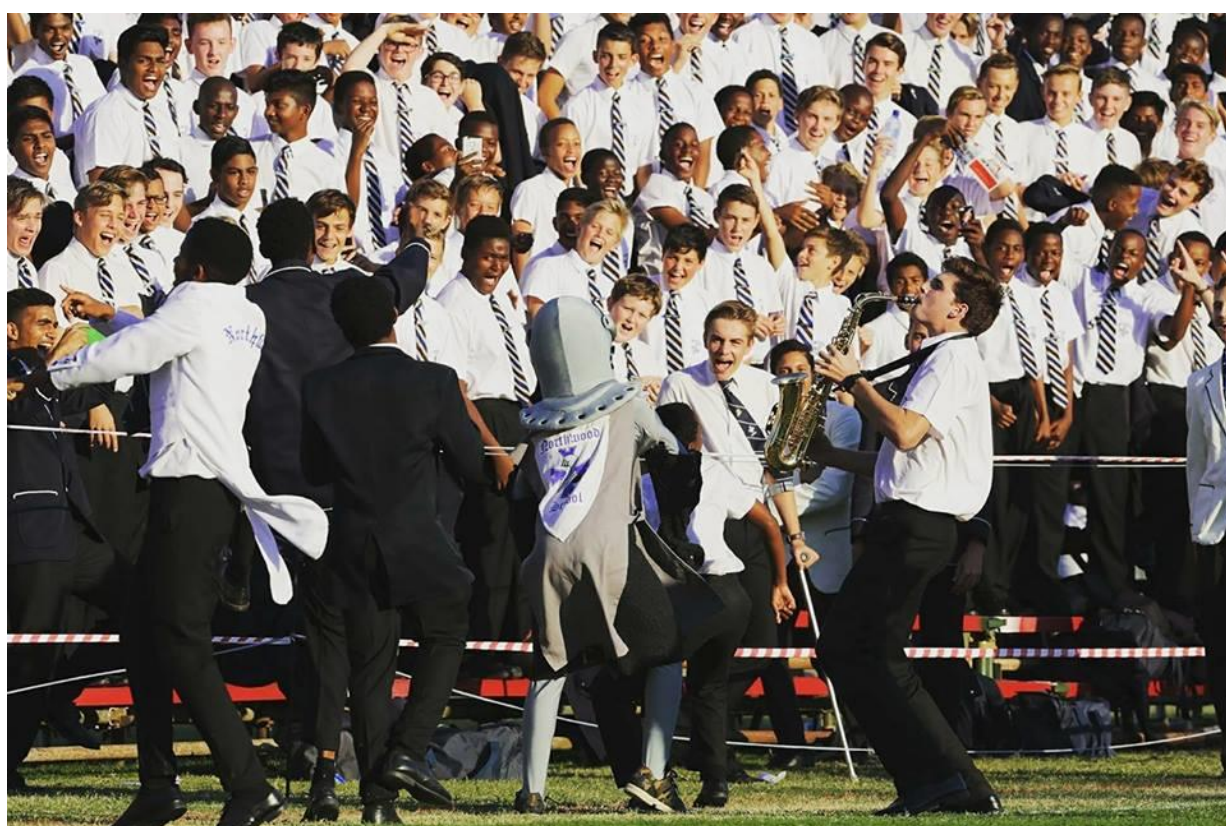
