From the Headmaster MR P VILJOEN

Dear Parents

Northwood School is lucky enough to be a fully-fledged member of the International Boys' Schools Association. This allows us access to international studies, research results, networking opportunities and professional development initiatives.

One of the studies undertaken recently, and of which Northwood and its boys has been a part, studied and attempted to measure character development amongst young men. These findings were particularly interesting and were presented at the Heads conference last week.

As a starting point the premise was that **"Character is why we do school". In other words:** "The development of whole young men of character who wrestle with their own sense of who they should be and what people expect of them in order to fulfil their obligations to others, their potential, and their beliefs about what is good and right is the most fundamental reason for a school for boys."

Character refers to how people live their lives in terms of the fulfilment of their obligations to others, their potential, and their fundamental beliefs about what is good and right for them to do.

It is a multi-layered idea that refers to the mark and measure of a person, a notion that encompasses their characteristics and idiosyncrasies, the extent of their resilience and robustness, and their capacity to model and lead through their virtues and qualities. This character is a product of processes that help individuals to realise their own character while also replicating the character expected of them by others."

In a time where boys are constantly bombarded with a society where integrity, honesty, a sense of purpose, hard work, resilience are often lacking, it is absolutely crucial that we, as a school, understand how important character education is. Our aim must most certainly, be to send young men into the world that possess strong character, men who understand why it is so important to act with integrity and to attempt to do the right thing the first time.

As Bob Marley once famously said: "The greatness of a man is not in how much wealth he acquires, but in his integrity and his ability to affect those around him positively."

Let's celebrate reading by reading! #readabook #buyabook



Did you know?

In South Africa, National Book Week takes place during the first week of September every year. This is a dedicated week reserved for the promotion of books and reading.

Reading is a powerful tool against inequality and poverty. When children read for pleasure, this has a greater effect on their educational achievement than their family's socio-economic status.

Children who read are able to easily overcome the hurdles often imposed by the low educational levels of their parents, their community's economics or the political systems of their country.

The better a child's language skills, the greater their chance of future academic success, educational achievement, employment and income.

Did you know that reading is one of the most important skills a child can learn because it will be difficult for a child to master any subject without knowing how to read?



Did you know that children who grow up in homes where books are plentiful go further in school than those who don't and have the highest reading scores? Children with low-education families can do as well as children with high-education families if they have access to books at home.

Did you know that students who read widely and frequently are higher achievers than students who read rarely and narrowly?

Did you know that studies have proven that increased family engagement in educational programs is linked with increases in child reading achievement and other academic successes?

There are books which can change our perspective on life, open our eyes to new experiences and emotions, bring comfort when we are sad, bring hope when we are down, bring joy and excitement at new possibilities and allow us to escape to another world or country without even leaving home.

The process of reading and the joy of reading are inextricably interwoven. By developing a love of reading in young children we are allowing them to experience more of life than what otherwise may be possible. Understanding and empathising with the emotions and thinking of characters or real life people in books we read is but one way of developing a greater depth of understanding of oneself.

Over time, with greater experience, our understanding deepens and in the end, we become a better person and a wiser person for understanding the perspectives of others – lessons learned

personally or vicariously through the books we read.

RECOMMENDED BOOKS FOR YOUR READING PLEASURE:

<u>Turtles All the Way Down, by John Green</u>

Turtles came in on a wave of concentrated hype, with just a handful of months elapsing between its announcement and its release. All hype aside, Green's first book since mega bestseller The Fault in Our Stars delivers the expected blend of funny/sad feels but goes darker, taking a deep dive into the cyclical, bullying terrain of its heroine's mental landscape. Like Green, Aza suffers from severe obsessive-compulsive disorder, and the book's gentle plot arc—Aza reconnects with a boy from her past, tries with her indomitable best friend to track down that boy's wildly wealthy tax criminal father, and navigates her loving, frustrating relationship with her widowed mother—is lain alongside the inescapable whirlpool of her thoughts. The book manages to be both satisfying and delicately incomplete, with an elegiac ending that expands its scope and highlights, excitingly, the maturation of Green's talents and range. La Belle Sauvage (Book of Dust series #1), by Philip Pullman

Pullman's return to the world of his beloved Dark Materials trilogy, set years before the events of The Golden Compass, is worth the 17-year wait. Malcolm, a kind and curious 11-year-old, is drawn into the world of alethiometers and science vs. magic/church vs. all things good when a baby is left in the care of the priory just across the river from his parents' inn. He's fascinated with the child, six-month-old Lyra Bellacqua, whose role in a prophecy places her at the centre of a grand custody battle. Malcolm's small world becomes populated with scholars and lords, evil men and church toadies, before a flood to end all floods sweeps the usual order away. In a transformed, postdiluvian world, Malcolm and companion Alice travel down the swollen waters with little Lyra, encountering menace and magic in increasingly surreal vignettes. The rigor of Pullman's richly wrought otherworld—one of violent religious zealots, bureaucratic oppressors, and a mixture of enchantment and scientific study—continues to entrance, and his soulful, earthbound hero is a fine foil to baby Lyra, whose mischief and brilliance are beautifully expressed through Pantalaimon's transformations. After Tomorrow, by Gillian Cross

What if you woke up tomorrow and everything had changed? After Tomorrow is an unflinchingly poignant but ultimately hopeful story from Carnegie Medal winning author Gillian Cross, exploring the struggle for survival within refugee camps. "The raiders headed right for us. There were half a dozen of them. Heavy, tall men with packs on their backs. And guns in their hands." Imagine a world where money is worthless, armed robbers roam the streets and no one is safe. For Matt and his little brother, Taco, that nightmare is a reality. Their choice: to stay or to escape through the Channel Tunnel, where unknown danger awaits. .This brand new novel from classroom favourite Gillian Cross is a powerful and thrilling story of survival, which will provoke debate and discussion from students and appeal to both boys and girls.

Elon Musk: Tesla, SpaceX, and the Quest for a Fantastic Future by Ashlee Vance

This fascinating biography, lights up the resilient American spirit in its portrayal of an ambitious visionary, an inspiring dreamer, and a persistent doer and innovator. Musk, born in South Africa, is a personality that was destined to thrive in America. As a child, he devoured all books in sight and resorted to reading through two sets of encyclopedias as well. "Vacuuming books into his brain," he is considered a "fact factory," with a "photographic memory." Author Vance notes that not all of Musk's childhood acquaintances appreciated his gifted mind, and some saw him as a target for bullying. Vance explores Musk's beginnings, ventures, and most importantly his vision for the future of humankind. Tesla, SpaceX, and the Quest for a Fantastic Future captures a snapshot in time of a man who already has had a tremendous impact on humanity and the way that we think. Vance is credited for writing a book that gives us far more understanding of not just Elon Musk the visionary, but also Elon Musk the person.
