Our primary goal at Northwood is participation and skill development not in one particular area but a multitude of areas that will broaden the learning experience received at Northwood. Any later than this, and the learner will not be excused and will be expected to fulfil his commitments to the team. Please also bear in mind the lessons that we teach our boys regarding commitment and dedication should this be something that is allowed on a regular basis.

Last Friday our 1st Softball team played their final game of the season and beat Glenwood 8-3 to ensure they won the league. This is a first in the School's history and we are incredibly proud of our boys. Well done to Mr Gow and his team.
