The great educational resource called Facebook, had this as a post a while ago. It's heading read, six little stories with lots of meaning:

Once all villagers decided to pray for rain. On the day of the prayer, all the people gathered, but only one boy came with an umbrella. That is faith.

When you throw babies in the air, they laugh because they know you will catch them. That is trust.

Every night we go to bed without assurance of being alive the next morning, but still we set alarms to wake up. That is hope.

We plan big things for tomorrow in spite of zero knowledge of the future. That is courage.

We see the world suffering but still we get married and have children. That is love.

- 1. You have taught them to love God;
- 2. You have always been there for your child and you have equipped them with a value system that allows them to make decisions that are acceptable to you as parents;
