Dear Parents

I have, during the last few years, read numerous pieces of literature, listened to a number of conversations and have heard experts speak on how our current generation of young people are lacking in terms of character, and especially the characteristic of resilience.

In essence these conversations, allude to the fact that the current crop of young people lack fight, determination and the strength to survive when things become difficult and simply seem to give up when the challenge seems too big to handle.
